Air Quality Control Implementation Plan

I. Introduction

A. This implementation plan is submitted as required by Section 110 of the Federal Clean Air Act and is to be considered as the official air pollution control plan for the State of Wyoming. This plan shall be applicable for the three air quality control regions which have been designated by the Environmental Protection Agency. After the Casper Intrastate Region designation was made the remaining counties in Wyoming were designated as the Wyoming Intrastate Air Quality Region.

The classification of the air quality control regions by the Environmental Protection Agency is shown below:

<u>Region</u>	<u>Designation Date</u>
1. Cheyenne Intrastate	October 31, 1970
2. Casper Intrastate	February 4, 1971
3. Wyoming Intrastate	March 31, 1971

Documentation notices of the designation of these air quality control regions are attached to this plan as Appendix A.

A map indicating geographical boundaries of the three regions and a listing of counties contained in each region is attached as Appendix B.

B. Primary concerns of this plan are the six pollutants for which national ambient air quality standards have been promulgated. Official notification of Wyoming's classification as required in Section 420.3, sub-part A, Part 420, Title 42, Federal Register, Volume 36, No. 158, was received by letter on August 30, 1971, as indicated in the copy attached as Appendix C.

Final classification for the six pollutants, i.e., suspended particulates, sulfur oxides, carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, hydrocarbons and photochemical oxidants are shown below:

A transcript record of the hearing is being held for the EPA Administrator's use, upon his request, in the office of the Wyoming Division of Health and Medical Services, State Office Building, Cheyenne, Wyoming 82001.
