

NOTICE OF PROPOSED REVISION TO TITLE V PERMIT

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) is proposing to revise the existing Title V permit that was previously issued to the following facility:

This is an existing facility applying for a significant permit revision for their Title V permit. The facility is a petroleum refinery proposing to install two new domed storage tanks that are subject to New Source Performance Standards (NSPS) 40 CFR 60 Subpart Kb and National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) 40 CFR 63 Subpart CC. One tank will store crude oil, and the other will store wastewater. The facility is also proposing to install domed roofs on two existing crude oil storage tanks (significantly reducing emissions) and increase throughput (slightly increasing emissions). In addition, the facility has proposed a SCAQMD Rule 1166 Compliance Plan for soil excavating, grading, and handling of contaminated soil related to site preparation for construction of the proposed new crude oil storage tank.

The SCAQMD has evaluated the permit applications 544857, 544859, 544860, 544861, and 550633 filed by the applicant and determined that the equipment operation and excavation will meet all applicable requirements of air quality Rules and Regulations. Pursuant to Title V of the federal Clean Air Act and SCAQMD Rule 3000(b)(31)(I), a facility with a Title V permit that proposes to install new equipment subject to a NSPS or NESHAP is considered a significant revision. Accordingly, the above facility has submitted a Title V significant revision application and requested the SCAQMD to revise their Title V permit.

The refinery will use the Best Available Control Technology (BACT) for controlling air emissions from this project. SCAQMD's calculations show that the two new storage tanks will potentially emit maximum emissions of 27 lbs/day of Volatile Organic Compound (VOC). However, the refinery will install domes on two

existing crude oil storage tanks, resulting in an overall potential maximum daily emission decrease of 141 lbs/day VOC.

The Title V permit includes all the emission limits and operating conditions imposed on the equipment. The facility is required to certify compliance with the Title V permit in addition to recordkeeping and mandatory reporting of any deviation of the permit conditions. A Title V permit is enforceable by the SCAQMD, by the federal government, and by citizens.

The proposed permit is available for public review at SCAQMD, 21865 Copley Dr., Diamond Bar, CA 91765 and at the Los Angeles City Public Library, 1300 N. Avalon Blvd, Wilmington, CA 90744.

Information regarding the facility owner's compliance history submitted to the SCAQMD pursuant to California Health & Safety Code Section 42336, or otherwise known to the SCAQMD based on credible information, is also available from the SCAQMD for public review. The public may request SCAQMD to conduct a public hearing on the proposed permit by submitting a Hearing Request Form (Form 500-G) to Danny Luong at the above SCAQMD address. The SCAQMD will hold a public hearing if there is evidence that the proposed permit is not correct or is not adequate to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements, and a hearing will likely provide additional information that will affect the drafting and/or issuance of the permit.
