The facility operates three spray booths, two ovens, a diesel fired emergency internal combustion engine, a solvent distillation unit, and other supporting equipment.

Pursuant to Title V of the federal Clean Air Act and AQMD Rule 3004(f), a Title V permit shall expire five years from the date of issuance unless such permit has been renewed. Accordingly, each of the above facilities has submitted a Title V renewal application and requested the AQMD to renew their Title V permit. Each of the proposed permits incorporates updates to the facility information provided in the facility's Title V renewal application and all rules and regulations that are currently applicable to the facility.

Comments must be received by January 5, 2011. The AQMD will consider all public comments and may revise the Title V permit in accordance with AQMD rules and regulations.

The public may request the AQMD to conduct a public hearing on any of the proposed permits by submitting a Hearing Request Form (Form 500-G) to Hamed Mandilawi at the above AQMD address. The AQMD will hold a public hearing if there is evidence that the proposed permits are not correct or are not adequate to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements, and a hearing will likely provide additional information that will affect the drafting and/or issuance of the permits.
