
The South Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD) has received and reviewed a Title V application for a Minor Permit Revision to the Chevron Product Corporation's (Chevron) Facility Permit. This Title V permit revision meets all the requirements of a Minor Permit Revision as defined in Rule 3000(b)(12).

Under Chevron's permit revision, the company has submitted a compliance plan to comply with the District's pressure relief device (PRD) monitoring requirements. After reviewing the plan, the District has approved Chevron's Rule 1173 Compliance Plan, submitted under Application No. 494607. This approval has no impact on emissions. There will be no increase in emissions as the plan is for installing monitoring devices to track releases from PRDs.

As required under Rule 3003(j), AQMD is providing a copy of the proposed permit to the EPA administrator for a 45-day review. A copy of the proposed revision to the existing Title V Permit, Section I, is attached which include our draft plan approval letter and plan evaluation for your review.
