In response to your request, dated May 14, 2012, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region IX, (EPA) hereby grants to the Clark County Department of Air Quality (CCDAQ) formal delegation of the following Code of Federal Regulations, Title 40, Part 63 (40 CFR Part 63) National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP), as they existed on July 1, 2011:

- Subpart VVVVVV - NESHAP for Chemical Manufacturing Area Sources
- Subpart AAAAAA - NESHAP for Area Sources: Asphalt Processing and Asphalt Roofing Manufacturing
- Subpart BBBB BB - NESHAP for Area Sources: Chemical Preparations Industry
- Subpart CCCCCC - NESHAP for Area Sources: Paints and Allied Products Manufacturing
- Subpart DDDDDDD - NESHAP for Area Sources: Prepared Feeds Manufacturing
- Subpart EEEEEEE - NESHAP: Gold Mine Ore Processing and Production Area Source Category

Regarding any other 40 CFR Part 63 standard previously delegated to NDEP, this letter is also delegating any amendments made to those standards as of July 1, 2011. In this letter, we are responding only to your request for delegation of 40 CFR Part 63 NESHAP. You will receive a separate letter addressing delegation of 40 CFR Part 60 Standards of Performance for New Stationary Sources.

These delegations are being granted in accordance with the August 26, 2010, Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between CCDAQ and EPA regarding the delegation of NESHAP. As set forth in the MOA, these delegations are effective upon the date of this letter and EPA will publish a future Federal Register notice to codify these delegations into the Code of Federal Regulations. Delegation constitutes an agreement to follow all applicable provisions of 40 CFR Parts 63, including the use of EPA's test methods and procedures. EPA retains the exclusive right for authorizing approval of equivalent and alternative control technologies and test methods. Therefore, the applicable subsections of the requested NESHAP may not be delegated.

We appreciate CCDAQ's efforts to implement the federal air toxics program and hope to continue working with you to reduce emissions of air toxics in Nevada. If you have any questions about this delegation, please call me at (415) 947-8715 or have your staff contact Rynda Kay at (415) 947-4118.
