Dear Ms. Wrona:

We received your April 17, 2008, request for delegation of Standards of Performance for New Stationary Sources (NSPS) and National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) pursuant to the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 40, (40 CFR) Parts 60 and 63. In this letter, we are responding only to your request for delegation of 40 CFR Part 63 NESHAP. You will receive a separate letter addressing delegation of 40 CFR Part 60 NSPS.

In response to your request, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region IX, (EPA) hereby grants to the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) formal delegation of the following 40 CFR Part 63 NESHAP, as they existed on July 1, 2006:

Subpart DDDD – NESHAP: Plywood and Composite Wood Products  
Subpart DDDDD - NESHAP for Industrial, Commercial, and Institutional Boilers and Process Heaters

Regarding any other 40 CFR Part 63 standard previously delegated to ADEQ, this letter is also delegating any amendments made to those standards as of July 1, 2006. These delegations are being granted in accordance with the September 18, 1997, Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between ADEQ and EPA regarding the delegation of NESHAP. As set forth in the MOA, these delegations are effective upon the date of this letter and EPA will publish a future Federal Register notice to codify these delegations into the Code of Federal Regulations.

We appreciate ADEQ's efforts to implement the federal air toxics program and hope to continue working with you to reduce emissions of air toxics in Arizona. If you have any questions about this delegation, please call me at (415) 947-8715 or have your staff contact Mae Wang at (415) 947-4124.
