





In response to your request, dated November 1, 2007, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region IX, (EPA) hereby grants to the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) formal delegation of the following National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) in the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 40, Part 63 (40 CFR Part 63), as it exists on July 1, 2007:

- Subpart IIII – NESHAP: Surface Coating of Automobiles and Light-Duty Trucks
- Subpart PPPP – NESHAP for Surface Coating of Plastic Parts and Products
- GGGGG – NESHAP: Site Remediation
- HHHHH – NESHAP: Miscellaneous Coating Manufacturing
- DDDDD – NESHAP for Polyvinyl Chloride and Copolymers Production Area Sources
- EEEEE – NESHAP for Primary Copper Smelting Area Sources
- FFFFF – NESHAP for Secondary Copper Smelting Area Sources
- GGGGGG – NESHAP for Primary Nonferrous Metals Area Sources – Zinc, Cadmium, and Beryllium

Regarding any other 40 CFR Part 63 standard previously delegated to NDEP, this letter is also delegating any amendments made to those standards as of July 1, 2007. In this letter, we are responding only to your request for delegation of 40 CFR Part 63 NESHAP. You will receive a separate letter addressing delegation of 40 CFR Part 60 Standards of Performance for New Stationary Sources.

These delegations are being granted in accordance with the September 3, 1997, Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between NDEP and EPA regarding the delegation of NESHAP. As set forth in the MOA, these delegations are effective upon the date of this letter and EPA will publish a future Federal Register notice to codify these delegations into the Code of Federal Regulations.

We appreciate NDEP's efforts to implement the federal air toxics program and hope to continue working with you to reduce emissions of air toxics in Nevada. If you have any questions about this delegation, please call me at (415) 947-8715 or have your staff contact Mae Wang at (415) 947-4124.
