We received the Maricopa County Air Quality Department's March 5, 2010, and April 5, 2010, requests for delegation of Standards of Performance for New Stationary Sources (NSPS) and National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) pursuant to the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 40 (40 CFR), Parts 60, 61, and 63. In this letter, we are responding only to your requests for delegation of 40 CFR Part 63 NESHAP. You will receive a separate letter addressing delegation of 40 CFR Part 60 NSPS and Part 61 NESHAP.

In response to your requests, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region IX, (EPA) hereby grants to the Maricopa County Air Quality Department formal delegation of the following 40 CFR Part 63 NESHAP, as they existed on July 1, 2008:


- Subpart WWWW – National Emission Standards for Hospital Ethylene Oxide Sterilizers
- Subpart YYYYY – NESHAP for Area Sources: Electric Arc Furnace Steelmaking Facilities
- Subpart ZZZZ – NESHAP for Iron and Steel Foundries Area Sources
- Subpart BBBB – NESHAP for Source Category: Gasoline Distribution Bulk Terminals, Bulk Plants, and Pipeline Facilities
- Subpart CCCCC – NESHAP for Source Category: Gasoline Dispensing Facilities
- Subpart DDDDD – NESHAP for Polyvinyl Chloride and Copolymers Production Area Sources
- Subpart EEEEE – NESHAP for Primary Copper Smelting Area Sources
- Subpart FFFFF – NESHAP for Secondary Copper Smelting Area Sources
- Subpart GGGGG – NESHAP for Primary Nonferrous Metals Area Sources – Zinc, Cadmium, and Beryllium
- Subpart HHHHH – NESHAP: Paint Stripping and Miscellaneous Surface Coating Operations at Area Sources
- Subpart LLLLL – NESHAP for Acrylic and Modacrylic Fibers Production Area Sources
- Subpart MMMMM – NESHAP for Carbon Black Production Area Sources
- Subpart NNNNN – NESHAP for Chemical Manufacturing Area Sources: Chromium Compounds
- Subpart OOOOO – NESHAP for Flexible Polyurethane Foam Production and Fabrication Area Sources
- Subpart PTTTT – NESHAP for Lead Acid Battery Manufacturing Area Sources
- Subpart QQQQQ – NESHAP for Wood Preserving Area Sources

Subpart RRRRRR – NESHAP for Clay Ceramics Manufacturing Area Sources
Subpart SSSSSS – NESHAP Glass Manufacturing Area Sources
Subpart TTTTTT – NESHAP for Secondary Nonferrous Metals Processing Area Sources

Regarding any other 40 CFR Part 63 NESHAP previously delegated to Maricopa County, this letter is also delegating any amendments made to those NESHAP as of July 1, 2008. These NESHAP are being delegated in accordance with the November 1, 1999, Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between Maricopa County and EPA regarding the delegation of NESHAP. As set forth in the MOA, these delegations are effective upon the date of this letter and EPA will publish a future Federal Register notice to codify these delegations into the Code of Federal Regulations.

We appreciate the Maricopa County Air Quality Department's efforts to implement the federal air toxics program and hope to continue working with you to reduce emissions of air toxics in Maricopa County.
