



Superfund Process

Short term decisions to be made

- End-use of ON Semi treated water
- Next steps in OU1 Vapor Intrusion Investigation
- OU3 Remedial Investigation will lead to an eventual decision on OU3 cleanup

Long term decisions to be made

- Getting to the final Record of Decision.
 - This is the site-wide remedy with timelines for complete cleanup of site
 - This involves deciding how to clean up underground pools of high concentrations that still remain, as well as contamination in bedrock. Main hurdle is what do we do about the DNAPL?
 - Consideration of “Technical Impracticability waiver” (nationally, this rarely used and is a last resort)

EPA and ADEQ working together

- EPA and ADEQ have different roles depending on the OU.
 - OU1 and OU2: ADEQ is the lead agency, with EPA oversight and support
 - OU3: EPA is the lead agency, with ADEQ support
 - Community Involvement: EPA is the lead agency, with ADEQ support
- EPA works with ADEQ on RODs and EPA is the final signatory.

Public participation goal

Inform

To provide the public with balanced and objective information to assist them in understanding the problem, alternatives, opportunities and/or solutions.

Consult

To obtain public feedback on analysis, alternatives and/or decisions.

Involve

To work directly with the public throughout the process to ensure that public concerns and aspirations are consistently understood and considered.

Collaborate

To partner with the public in each aspect of the decision including the development of alternatives and the identification of the preferred solution.

Empower

To place final decision-making in the hands of the public.

Promise to the public

We will keep you informed.

We will keep you informed, listen to and acknowledge concerns and aspirations, and provide feedback on how public input influenced the decision.

We will work with you to ensure that your concerns and aspirations are directly reflected in the alternatives developed and provide feedback on how public input influenced the decision.

We will look to you for advice and innovation in formulating solutions and incorporate your advice and recommendations into the decisions to the maximum extent possible.

We will implement what you decide.
