

MAIN CONCERN: THE LACK OF COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & OVERSIGHT

The lack of community involvement in the Superfund Remedial process and resulting impacts have placed the environmental justice community at a disadvantage and exposed the community to unacceptable risks.

We have five core community demands that correct the lack of community involvement at this time:

REMEDICATION

1. Genuine Community Engagement & Oversight of Superfund Remediation.

Full official engagement of the environmental justice organization SLAM and associated organizations in the Superfund Remedial process. A complete, adequate, timely and on going participation in the Superfund Remedial process is desperately needed. We need an equitable table where community representatives from environmental justice organizations are able to help set agendas and fully participate in the oversight of the remediation process.

2. On-Going Scientific Technical Assistance

Sufficient technical assistance to allow the environmental justice community members in SLAM and associated organizations to provide meaningful input and participate in the Superfund process.

3. Timely Monitoring Data

Provide the environmental justice community SLAM with the ability to require and receive real time monitoring data in association with remedial activities.

REDEVELOPMENT

1. Engagement of SLAM in the Covenant Deferral Request Process

Enable SLAM and associated organizations to participate in the Covenant Deferral Request process through out the process.

2. Engagement of SLAM in the Early Transfer Process

Enable SLAM and associated organizations to participate in the early transfer process and evaluate the adequacy of parties designated to receive the transferred property.
