I find it disturbing that it seems hydraulic fracturing is being focused on to prove adverse affects to our water and where is the drilling phase of this extraction process?

Drilling is the primary part of the process that has impacted our private, water wells for years since 2008 in Susquehanna County, Pa..

We have a large group of DEP documents and investigations and determinations and consent orders outlining the impacts on our water wells in our State of Pa. in the dozens of counties now being drilled for over five years.

The EPA Study needs to focus on drilling in addition to the Fracking phase. There is enough documentation to show the impacts to our water.

And I want to encourage including others who have studied this issue for years from Duke University and Cornell University and I don't see them represented. Is there any reason for this?

I see other Universities and groups that have encouraged the safety of fracking and drilling and find this panel skewed in favor of Industry.
