Dear Angela, I am Juan Parras, who testified at a previous SAB conference call regarding the refiner rule that is being proposed by the EPA. Enclosed is a snap shot of the Manchester Community in Houston's East End. It is literally surrounded by refineries, chemical, and a huge fertilizer plant. The fertilizer plant can cause serious injury, bodily harm, or death if an accident similar to the West, Texas incident occurs. Take a look at the Green Peace website on Chemical Plants that put communities at risk and you will find that the Rhodia Plant could have an impact on over 2 million persons. I am sending you this picture so that you can get a better handle on the reasons we very concern on cumulative impacts on the refinery rules.
